Mercer Planning Board Ordinance Section 1. Title and Purpose:

The title of this ordinance shall be "Re-Establishment of the Town of Mercer Planning Board". It's purpose is to replace and revise the original establishment of the Planning Board, as set forth in Section 12, A, 1 of the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Mercer, adopted by the town in 1974.

## Section 2. Authority:

- 2.1 This ordinance is enacted pursuant to the authority given the Town in 30-A M.R.S.A. 3001 (Home Rule).
- 2.2 The effective date of this ordinance shall be March 7, 1992.
- Section 3. Composition of the Board:
  - 3.1 The Board shall consist of 5 members.
  - 3.2 The term of each member shall be 3 years.
- 3.3 Three members shall be elected by the Town by Australian ballot, one each in successive years as the terms of the current elected members expire.
- 3.4 Two members shall be appointed by the selectmen. Appointments to be made within 60 days of the date of the Town Meeting.
- 3.5 The two initial appointments shall be for 2 and 3 years respectively. Thereafter all appointments shall be for 3 years.
  - 3.6 Selectmen may be members of the Board.
- 3.7 When there is a permanent vacancy of either an elected or appointed member, the selectmen shall appoint a replacement as soon as possible.
  - 3.8 All members shall be sworn by the Town Clerk.

## Section 4. Organization:

- 4.1 The Board shall elect a chairperson from among its members within 60 days of the date of Town Meeting. The chairperson's term shall be for 1 year, with eligibility for re-election.
- 4.2 The Board may either elect a secretary from among its members or hire a non-board member to serve as secretary.
- 4.3 The secretary shall keep a record of the Board's meetings, transactions, correspondence, findings, and determinations. All records shall be deemed public and may be inspected at reasonable times.

## Section 5. Duties and Powers:

- 5.1 The Board shall perform such duties and exercise such powers as are provided by Town of Mercer ordinance and the laws of the State of Maine.
- 5.2 The Board may obtain goods and services necessary to its proper function within the limits of appropriations made for the purpose.
- Section 6. Validity and Amendments:
- 6.1 Should any section or provision of this ordinance be declared by any court to be invalid, such decision shall not invalidate any other section or provision.
- 6.2 This ordinance may be amended by majority vote of the Town at any Town Meeting, the warrant for which gives notice of the proposed change.
